

PHD and RESEARCH MASTERS 2022 GUIDELINE FOR THESIS/ DISSERTATION SUBMISSIONS

The AVERAGE time from

submission to exam outcome is 4 MONTHS

The process can be delayed for reasons beyond our control

Avoid unnecessary delay and disappointment

INTENTION TO SUBMIT

- Triggers preparations for receipt of dissertation and appointment of two examiners
- Failure to complete this step can delay examiner appointment by up to 6 weeks Deadline: At least 5 months before the deadline for qualifier entry:
 - 1 June 2022 for December 2022
 - 1 September 2021 for first 2023 graduation ceremony. Details to follow.

For a 50% rebate* of the dissertation course fee, please refer to the 2022 fees handbook.

For a 25% rebate* of the dissertation course fee, ease refer to the 2022 fees handbook

*Only available in your 2nd or subsequent year of registration for dissertation

SUBMISSION

- ONE electronic copy
- Up to TWO soft copies on request
- Allow at least EIGHT weeks for examination
- Students who intend on submitting prior to, or by 12noon on the first day of the 2023 term are not required to re-register and pay fees for the 2023 academic year

CORRECTIONS NEEDED?

- 6 months for corrections; 12 months for revise and resubmit
- To confirm you have met qualification requirements, the Faculty Examination Committee (FEC) exam committee needs:
- i) Certificate of Corrections approved by Supervisor
- ii) Evidence revised dissertation has been uploaded to the Library Deadline: 31 October for graduation in December 2022 and by 31 January for Autumn 2023.

GRADUATION

- Dec 2022: Those confirmed as qualifiers by the FEC by 31 October 2022.
- Missed the 31 October deadline?
 - i) The details and deadlines for the 2023 graduation ceremonies will be posted as soon as confirmed
 - ii) Academic record will confirm your qualifier status (can be used to apply for jobs/study)
 - iii) You can request an additional letter from the Student Records Office
