In 2016, BEEP and EESI cemented their partnership by boosting the mentoring capacity for 40 young BEEP mentors.

The 40 young BEEP mentors hail from township-based schools in Cape Town, ranging in age from 15-18.

In their role as a BEEP mentor, they are enlisted to take up responsibilities within the organisation: from facilitating environmental workshops to taking younger members on overnight hikes to Table Mountain.




