


JOURNAL OF COMPARATIVE LAW IN AFRICA – CALL FOR PAPERS



The **Journal of Comparative Law in Africa** (JCLA) is a peer-reviewed, bilingual (English and French), law journal founded in 2013. It is a **DHET** accredited journal, published bi-annually by **JUTA** and the **Centre for Comparative Law in Africa** at the **University of Cape Town**, South Africa.

The Journal seeks to address legal issues relevant to the African continent. It encourages scholars, practitioners and jurists using a comparative approach or methodology in substantive and procedural law in Africa to submit original articles which may be conceptual, practice or empirical papers. Book reviews and recent developments such as potentially influential judgments are also considered. Submissions under consideration elsewhere, or which are not presented in standard academic article format, will not be considered.

CALL FOR PAPERS 2021

The JCLA invites the submission of manuscripts for publication. The final decision on whether a manuscript is accepted for publication is made by the JCLA Editorial Board, taking into consideration the recommendations of **two (2) anonymous referees**. The decision of the Editorial Board is communicated as soon as possible, usually about **three to four (3-4) months** from the submission date. Please note that COVID-induced remote working conditions may affect peer review timelines and kindly bear with any delay. If any of the referees suggests revisions to an article, feedback will be conveyed to the author and a short period will be allowed for revision if the author wishes to do so.



Manuscripts should be written in English or French, with an abstract in the same language and, if possible, in the other language. Manuscripts for articles should be between 8000 and 12000 words, excluding abstracts and references. Abstracts have a maximum of 350 words, while book reviews have a maximum of 3000 words. Please use MS-word, font 12 Times New Roman, 1.5 spacing, and font 10 for footnotes. Manuscripts longer than the recommended length will be considered for publication only on a special basis. The journal house style and the JUTA publication style are available on the website of the Centre for Comparative Law in Africa (www.comparative law.uct.ac.za) and upon request.
