From the Editorial Board.

We are happy to announce that the **Journal of Comparative Law in Africa (JCLA)**, published by the Centre for Comparative Law in Africa, at the University of Cape Town, has been accredited by the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET), South Africa. This accreditation takes effect from 1 January 2020.

The JCLA is a peer-reviewed bi-annual academic legal journal which promotes indigenous African scholarship, and primarily seeks to publish rigorous research in the field of comparative law in Africa and for this purpose, comparative law is broadly defined to cover public, private and commercial law involving more than one jurisdiction. Rigorous research is understood as work which *expands human knowledge on a subject by presenting original data or introducing new techniques or theories, or by blending, refuting, or contrasting existing ideas in a convincing manner.*

The Journal encourages scholars and jurists writing on all fields of law in Africa using a comparative approach or methodology to submit their original writings for publication in both English and French languages. It welcomes research, conceptual, practice and empirical papers. Book reviews and viewpoints will also be considered.
