## Dear Alumni and Friends

The images of the fire that has ravaged the slopes of Table Mountain since Sunday morning have been seen across the world. The damage to UCT and in particular to the Library, which many of you will remember as Jagger Library, is incalculable. The university has started the slow and measured process of taking stock of the damage and planning out the work that needs to be done.

Our most important priority now is to see to the safety and wellbeing of our students. All students and staff were safely evacuated from the campus, and students are currently accommodated in hotels and other spaces across Cape Town. The generosity of people in and around Cape Town in helping us achieve that cannot be overestimated.

For the next week, we estimate that we will need to feed some 4,000 students and help many to either find longer term accommodation or return to families and friends. UCT asked Gift of the Givers to undertake the task of feeding our students, and they are doing so with the support of so many members of the UCT and Cape Town community.

We have received very many requests from alumni asking how they can help. Our immediate priority is to respond to the needs of our students, particularly those that were displaced as a result of the fire. You can do this by donating to the UCT Emergency Relief Fund, the details of which appear below. In time, once the extent of the devastation to our campus has been assessed, we will be able to articulate our efforts to manage the loss of collections, materials and buildings and the ways in which you can assist.
