Ms Njoki Mboce teaches at the School of Law, University of Nairobi, Kenya, where she lectures in Maritime Law, Administrative Law, and Governance. She is a Doctoral Scholar in International Maritime Law and holds an LL.M in International Trade and Investments. Her research and teaching interests lie in maritime law, democracy and governance, administrative law, and alternative dispute resolution.

She is an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya, the Principal at Njoki Mboce & Company Advocates, and a Commissioner for Oaths. Prior to joining the University of Nairobi, she was an associate at Anjarwalla & Khanna, part of the Africa Legal Network. Alongside her academic and legal practice, she is an active trial advocacy trainer, offering pro bono training with Justice Advocacy Africa and the Trial Advocacy Training Institute. She has facilitated programs in Kenya, Botswana, and Uganda, and served as an international faculty member.

Ms Mboce has presented her research at national and international conferences and has published in peer-reviewed journals. She has supervised more than twenty undergraduate and postgraduate students and continues to mentor emerging scholars in law. Her recognitions include the Olu Akinkugbe Business Law in Africa Fellowship (2019), the Africa Visiting Fellowship Programme for Eminent Scholars (2017-2018) at the Institute of Defence Studies and Analyses, India, and the Faculty of Law Merit Scholarship for Doctoral Studies at the University of Nairobi.
