

DR ALIOUNE BADARA THIAM

Dr Alioune Badara Thiam is of Senegalese nationality. He studied law at the University of Dakar before moving to China where he completed his LLM degree in International Law and Chinese Law at Wuhan University, Hubei Province. He completed his PhD degree at the University of Macau, China, which examined avenues to foster legal integration in Africa with particular emphasis on the Organisation for the Harmonization of Business Law in Africa (OHADA), the African Intellectual Property Organization (OAPI) and the inter-African Conference on Insurance Market (CIMA). While doing his PhD, Alioune won the doctoral scholarship award of the Hague Academy of International Law in 2012 and has done several internships including one at the CIMA headquarters in Libreville, Gabon and another at the OAPI in Yaoundé, Cameroun. Back in Senegal he teaches among others Contract Law, Commercial Law, African Institutions of Trade, doing business in emerging countries in several institutions, including Ecole supérieure de commerce (SUPDECO) British Business school (BBC), Bordeaux Management School (BEM) that are some of the best universities in Senegal specialising in business education.

Dr Thiam maintains a keen interest in a variety of legal issues around which he has presented papers at international conferences on commercial law, China-Africa relations, and co-habitation of legal orders. His research interests are in International Trade and Investment Law, Corporate Law, Intellectual Property, Regional Integration in Africa, ChinaAfrica Relations and he has published widely in these areas in international law journals. Dr Thiam is committed to exploring issues in the area of business law and comparative law from a multidisciplinary as well as national, regional and international dimensions.
