Dr Victor Amadi teaches Law and Regional Integration in Africa and Comparative Law and Business in Africa at the University of Cape Town, South Africa. He is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Centre for Comparative Law in Africa (CCLA). His scholarship focuses on comparative regional integration and development in Africa, with particular emphasis on trade law and migration governance. He holds LLB, LLM, and LLD degrees from the University of the Western Cape.

His doctoral thesis investigated the facilitation of intra-regional trade through the movement of persons in the Southern African Development Community (SADC). He has authored several peer-reviewed publications and is the author of *Trade, Migration and Law: Free Movement of Persons in the Southern African Development Community (SADC)*, published by Routledge in 2022. His work engages with the intersection of legal norms, regional economic cooperation, and human mobility on the African continent.
