Dr Yvonne Idun is an expert in international environmental law and international trade law with over two decades of experience spanning Africa, the Caribbean, the Middle East, North America, and South-East Asia. She holds a PhD and an LLM in the Law of International Trade and International Environmental Law from the University of Cape Town, as well as a BA in Law and French from the University of Ghana. She also completed certificates in Project Management, Monitoring and Evaluation from the Galilee International Management Institute (Israel), and in French Language and Civilization from the Institut Supérieur Privé in France.

Dr Idun has held multiple academic and leadership positions, most notably as Senior Lecturer and Chairperson of the Public Law Department at Kenyatta University, Kenya, where she taught Criminal Law, Administrative Law, International Environmental Law, International Trade Law, Refugee and IDP Law, and Constitutional Law. She played a central role in enhancing research infrastructure, mentoring students, and promoting outreach projects in underserved Kenyan communities.

Fluent in English, French, and several African languages, Dr Idun is currently Chairperson of the Board Sub-Committee on Research, Programmes and Partnerships at the Centre for Environmental Impact Analysis. She is also engaged in consultancies and legal training for diplomats, civil society actors, and youth leaders on emerging sustainability issues, including Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) frameworks. Her professional work includes collaborations with multilateral institutions such as UNEP, UNIDO, and UNDP.
