ABBREVIATED CURRICULUM VITAE

Professor Murray is a South African, educated at the Universities of Stellenbosch and Michigan. She works primarily on constitution-making processes, constitutional design and drafting. She is Professor Emeritus at the University of Cape Town and a Visiting Fellow at Kellogg College, University of Oxford.

In 1994 she was elected by the South African Constitutional Assembly to serve on the seven-member Panel of Experts established to advise it. In that capacity she was also a member of the smaller 'technical refinement team' responsible for the language of the South African Constitution. Subsequently, she served on the bodies established to prepare draft constitutions in Kenya in 2009 - 2010 (as a member of the Committee of Experts) and in Fiji in 2012 (as a member of the Constitution Commission). Between 2014 – 16 and 2017 – 24 she was a fulltime member of the UN, DPPA Mediation Support Unit, Standby Team.

Since 1994, she has combined academic and practical work on matters relating to constitutionalism, the rule of law, human rights, gender, and democratic transitions with a focus on constitutional design (including the design of political systems, multilevel systems of government, electoral systems, fiscal federalism, and inclusion) and the design of constitution-making and review processes. Among other things, in 2014 she spent 6 months working with the Yemen Constitution Drafting Commission, and more recently, mainly through work with the UN, she has supported and advised politicians, constitution makers, civil society activists and UN officials in Armenia, Sudan, South Sudan, Tuvalu, Somalia, Chile, Libya, Papua New Guinea (on the Bougainville issue), Guinea Bissau, The Gambia, Ghana, Myanmar, Libya and the Caribbean, among other places. She teaches annually in the Central European University summer school in the course on Constitution Building in Africa

Between 1995 and 2004, she was Director of the Law, Race and Gender Research Unit (LRG) at the University of Cape Town. Between March 2016 and February 2017, she was Director of the Bingham Centre for the Rule of Law in London.

Her work includes academic research, reports for government and other institutions, 'briefing documents', and training and advice for constitution makers, politicians and civil society engaged in political change, on issues including building democracy, constitutionalism and the rule of law, traditional leadership, women and gender, and matters of constitutional design (electoral systems, executive power, legislatures, rights, the judiciary, federalism and multilevel government, and fiscal federalism).
