Property rates and taxes determined and collected by municipalities affect all property owners in South Africa. Since it directly affects their finances, property owners attempt to have their valuations decreased to save money on rates and taxes, and the Valuation Appeal Boards are tasked with adjudicating these appeals.

The objective of this course will be to analyse, interpret and discuss the provisions of the Municipal Property Rates Act of 2004 with specific emphasis on the objection and appeal processes provided therein and the Valuation Appeal Board's process and procedures, obligations and responsibilities. Attention will also be given to the role of valuers and legal representatives at the appeal hearings.
