COURSE FEE

It focuses on the negotiation and structure of key global markets agreements, namely the 2002 ISDA® Master Agreement (ISDA), 2011 Global Master Repurchase Agreement (GMRA) and 2010 Global Master Securities Lending Agreement (GMSLA).

- The purpose and architecture of global master agreements
- Key legal concepts such as netting, close-out, and representations
- Typical negotiation points and commercial considerations
- Common pitfalls and how to avoid them
- The role of these agreements in treasury, risk, and trading functions
- Current market developments, including post-LIBOR reforms and margin regulations

The course blends legal insight with practical deal experience, empowering attendees to engage meaningfully with documentation in cross-border transactions.
